


TOP SHELF.

- Clapperton*
- Back Row 9½" Plate salved in 1912 from Armada Ship sunk in Tobermory Bay 1588.
12½" Plate by Thomas Alderson with cipher of King George IV. Probably one of the pewter set used at the Coronation Banquet in Westminster Hall, all of which was stolen by the spectators.
9⅝" Plate by Mary Redshaw. From Staple Inn. Engraved on back "Staple" Inn 1751.
- Front Row 6" Tankard, Mark  circa 1650
2¼" Measure circa 1700
6" Tankard by William Bethune, Circa 1689.
4¾" Tankard, with outline portraits of William and Mary
4" Tankard, temp. Charles I. *mark (95)*
4¾" Tankard with outline portraits of William and Mary

Both tankards in the exhibition photo are said to be William and Mary and of the same height.

These two are surely of the same (or close) height. As one of them appears not to be Wm & Mary the photos above might not be the tankards in the exhibition photo.

They were filed with the exhibition photo and said to be in the Clapperton Collection.

The Hunterian Museum Collections website section states that they hold the Clapperton Collection and various paperwork including purchase details. This website has thus written to the museum to ask if they have details of when these two tankards were purchased and who from.
